Tregantle Field

A discussion was held on the work required to make the track to Tregantle Farm take-off suitable for cars. Aided by Bills excellent reconnaissance photos.

Whilst this is now not relevant, as permission to use this site has been denied. It did however, bring to light some very interesting points.

- 1 The surprising amount of materials and cost attributed to working on a track in this condition and length. 20 to 30 ton of material was estimated by some well informed members.
- 2. The logistics involved in delivery, placing and spreading this amount of material.
- 3. The implication that rendering the track suitable for are vehicles would also make it accessible to the Surfers and general public... We may have then had to buy a gate.

It may have cost us up to £1000 in total.

Would all of this been acceptable to the farmer?

These points should be considered when seeking other site options.
